Summary: Tennessee offers special benefits for its military Service members and Veterans Including Veterans Employment Preference, Property Tax Relief, County Motor Vehicle Tax, Dependent Children's Scholarship, Special Vehicle License Plates, Burial Eligibility in Tennessee's State Veterans Cemeteries, as well as lifetime Hunting, Fishing license and State Park privileges. Eligibility for some benefits may depend on residency, military component, and Veteran disability status.

## State Benefit Highlights and Eligibility

State Income Tax: No state income tax in Tennessee. The individual income tax is imposed only on individuals and other entities receiving interest from bonds and notes and dividends from stock.

**Property Tax:** Disabled Veterans and their surviving Spouse may qualify for a rebate or exemption of taxes on a specified portion of the value of property used as their residence. The Veteran or surviving Spouse must own and use property as primary residence. The maximum market value on which tax relief is calculated is \$175,000. If residence is a mobile home, a copy of the title or bill of sale is required. Apply through the county trustee; or, if property is within the city limits, application can also be made by contacting your city collecting official.

For Disabled Veteran\*--Disability must fall within the categories of a service-connected disability (that resulted in paraplegia OR permanent paralysis of both legs and lower part of the body resulting from traumatic injury or disease to the spinal cord or brain OR loss of or the loss of use of, two or more limbs OR legal blindness), a 100% total and permanent disability rating from a service-connected disability, or a 100% total and permanent disability rating from being a prisoner of war.

For Surviving Spouse of Disabled Veteran\*--Surviving Spouse must have been eligible for disabled Veteran's property tax relief at the time of the disabled Veteran's death. If a subsequent amendment to the law would have made the deceased Veteran eligible, then property tax relief shall also be extended to the surviving Spouse. Qualifying Veteran must have been eligible due to a service-connected disability (that resulted in paraplegia OR permanent paralysis of both legs and lower part of the body resulting from traumatic injury or disease to the spinal cord or brain OR loss of or the loss of use of, two or more limbs OR legal blindness), a total and permanent disability rating from a service-connected disability, or a 100% total and permanent disability rating from being a prisoner of war; or death must have resulted from a service-connected, combat-related, cause or KIA (killed in action). Spouses must provide a form of personal identification (Driver's License, Military ID, or Social Security Card) and, a copy of the disabled Veteran's death certificate. A surviving Spouse must have been married to the Veteran at the time of death and must NOT be remarried in order to be eligible.

\*Determination of eligibility will be made based on information provided by the VA through use of consent forms (F-16) for a Disabled Veteran, or (F16S) for a Widow(er) of a Disabled Veteran available at the county trustee's office or the city collecting officials' office.

Retired Military Pay: Beginning with tax year 2012, the annual Hall Income Tax standard income exemptions for taxpayers 65 years of age or older increases from \$16,200 to \$26,200 for single filers and from \$27,000 to \$37,000 for joint filers.

Military Disability Retired Pay: Retirees who entered the military before September 24, 1975, and members receiving disability retirements based on combat injuries or who could receive disability payments from the VA are covered by laws giving disability broad exemption from federal income tax. Most military retired pay based on service -related disabilities also is free from federal income tax, but there is no guarantee of total protection.

VA Disability Dependency and Indemnity Compensation: VA benefits are not taxable because they generally are for disabilities and are not subject to federal or state taxes.

Military SBP/RSSBP/RCSBP/RSFPP: Generally subject to state taxes for those states with Income tax. Check with state department of revenue office.

**Motor Vehicle Sales Tax:** Active duty Soldiers stationed at in Tennessee are exempt from the sales and use tax of motor vehicles. In order for the vehicle to qualify for the exemption, it must meet the definition of a "motor vehicle"; it must be registered in Tennessee and must be titled in the same name of the qualifying individual, either alone or jointly with a spouse or lineal relative.

Eligibility: Soldiers who are engaged in active, full-time military service and are stationed in Tennessee. Soldiers of the Tennessee National Guard who are engaged in active, full-time military service as participants in Active Guard and Reserve (AGR) and are stationed in Tennessee. Reservists engaged in active, full-time military service as participants in the Active Guard and Reserve Program (AGR) and are stationed in Tennessee. Guardsmen/Reservists who have been called into active military service of the United States and are stationed in a combat zone, provided that the exemption will commence from the effective date of official military orders and will expire ninety (90) days after the effective date of official military orders.

County Automobile Tax: A Veteran may be exempt from a county automobile personal use tax.

Any disabled Veteran who has a 100 percent permanent, total disability from a service connected cause, or any former prisoner-of-war, as determined by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, shall be exempt from the motor vehicle privilege tax upon submission of evidence of such disability to the officer in the county charged with the responsibility for collecting such tax.

Eligibility: A Veteran who is 100% disabled.

## **Education Benefits:**

Tennessee National Guard Scholarship Program: Tennessee National Guard Association (NGATN) offers six (6) \$1,500.00 scholarships in the following categories: one (1) exclusively for an active Army or Air National Guard member; two (2) for active members of the NGATN or their dependents; two (2) active members of the Tennessee National Guard. If an active member of the Tennessee Army or Air National Guard does not qualify for the stipend, these scholarships may be awarded to any qualified son or daughter of an active member of the Tennessee National Guard.; one (1) for a current member of the TN National Guard or qualified son or daughter who participated in Operation Desert Storm, Noble Eagle, Enduring Freedom and Iraql Freedom.

Eligibility: National Guard Service member.

Combat Veterans Can Register Early for State Classes: A military Veteran who is a current resident of this state or whose home of record for military purposes is Tennessee and who is a student at a public institution of higher education shall be allowed to register for classes prior to the general student population at any public institution of higher education. Early registration shall occur using the same procedure used by student athletes, disabled students and honor students, if such groups are permitted to early register.

Dependent Children's Scholarship: Free tuition, maintenance fees, student activities fees, registration fees, and admittance fees required at any college or university in TN, owned, operated, and maintained by the state.

Eligibility: Dependent children (under 23 years of age) or Spouse of Armed Forces Members killed or who died as a result of injuries received or officially reported as being either a prisoner-of-war or missing-in-action while serving as a member of the Armed Forces during a qualifying period of armed conflict are eligible. Must be a TN resident and under the age of 23. To be eligible for these benefits, the dependent child or Spouse must present a certificate from the United States Government, and he/she cannot be receiving benefits under Public Law 634 or such other Federal

Laws offering like or similar benefits, and must meet the above requirements. Notice of the waiver program must be published in the institutional catalogs and class schedules. Application available at Financial Aid Office, Records Office, or Bursar's Office at the school selected by the student.

**Helping Heroes Grant for Veterans:** The grant will be available each year to as many as 375 eligible Veterans on a first-come, first-serve basis and will award \$1,000 to students completing at least twelve (12) semester hours each term.

Eligibility: Applicants need to have been awarded The Iraq Campaign Medal, The Afghanistan Campaign Medal, or The Global War on Terrorism expeditionary Medal.

Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children: It is the purpose of this compact to remove barriers to educational success imposed on children of military Families because of frequent moves and deployment of their parents by:

Facilitating the timely enrollment of children of military Families and ensuring that they are not placed at a disadvantage due to difficulty in the transfer of educational records from the previous school district or variations in entrance or age requirements.

Facilitating the student placement process through which children of military Families are not disadvantaged by variations in attendance requirements, scheduling, sequencing, grading, course content or assessment.

Facilitating the qualification and eligibility for enrollment, educational programs, and participation in extracurricular academic, athletic and social activities.

Facilitating the on-time graduation of children of military Families.

Providing for the promulgation and enforcement of administrative rules implementing the provisions of this compact,

Providing for the uniform collection and sharing of information between and among member states, schools and military Families under this compact.

Promoting coordination between this compact and other compacts affecting military children.

Promoting flexibility and cooperation between the educational system, parents and the student in order to achieve educational success for the student.

# **Employment Benefits:**

**Employment Assistance:** State employee receives 15 days paid military leave per fiscal year for active duty, active duty training, and *inactive duty training*. An employee can carry over a maximum of 15 days into the next fiscal year. **Eligibility:** State employee on orders for Annual Drill or active duty in the National Guard or as a Reserve of the Armed Forces.

Veterans Employment Preference: Veterans receive 5 points for Veteran's status and disabled Veterans receive 10 points on state examinations for state employment. Credit for years of military service received in State employment. Ten (10) points will be added to the passing examination scores of the Spouse or unremarried Spouse of a one hundred percent (100%) service-connected disabled Veteran or the unremarried Spouse of a Veteran killed on active duty during the eligibility periods listed below. Five (5) points will be added to the passing examination scores of the Spouse or unremarried Spouse of a one hundred percent (100%) service-connected disabled Veteran or unremarried Spouse of a Veteran killed on active duty during any other time period.

**Eligibility:** Tennessee Veterans preference points are only added to passing examination scores on Career Service appointment registers. To receive Veterans preference points, you must be a present or former member of the United States Armed Forces, have served on active duty during the service eligibility periods, have received an honorable discharge, and be a legal resident of the State of Tennessee.

**Veterans Assistance:** U.S. Millitary Veterans will be provided Priority of Service in all TN Career Centers from all partners and programs funded by the U.S Department of Labor. All Veterans are eligible for job referral and referral to training programs through the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development offices (TDLWD).

**Eligibility:** All U.S. military Veterans. Proof of military service (DD214, discharge papers, etc.) must be provided when visiting a TN Career Center.

### **Division of Motor Vehicles:**

There are more than 25 Veteran related specialty plates offered in the state of Tennessee. To find out more about all specialty plates and how to obtain them, please visit the Tennessee Department of Revenue website.

Active Military License Plate: This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and who are active members of the United States military and military reserves. Active military applicants must provide a current copy of their LES and stationing orders, along with a copy of the vehicle's registration.

Military Retired: Retired military applicants must provide a military ID card and show one of the following official military forms to prove their retired status: DD Form 2A (RES), DD Form 2N (RES), DD Form 2MC (RES), DD Form 2AF (RES), DD Form 2CG (RES) or DD214 which reflects 20 years of honorable military service. Please note: Retired military applicants must submit proof of their retired status each year upon renewal of their vehicle's registration. Retired military members can elect to choose to obtain a retired and honorably discharged plate instead, which only requires the submission of proof upon initial application.

The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

National Guard Member License Plate: Officers and enlisted members of the Tennessee National Guard and Spouses are eligible. <u>Initial Fee</u> is \$25.75. <u>Annual Fee</u> is \$21.50 for automobiles and \$14.50 for motorcycles, free first plate for enlisted members. Each National Guard enlisted member must provide a letter of eligibility identifying them by name, social security number, indicating they are in good standing with the unit and are eligible to have National Guard plates issued if they are not on the eligibility list. If discharged from the Guard prior to the expiration of the registration under which it was issued, the special plate may remain valid for display on the vehicle until the expiration date of the registration. National Guard retirees may obtain this plate with a retired decal affixed. Application must be accompanied by current and valid Armed Forces of Tennessee card stating retired status.

Air Medal - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and who are recipients of the Air Medal. Applicants must provide a letter or DD214 from the Department of Veterans Affairs indicating they are an Air Medal recipient. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

**Blue Star Family** - Blue Star Family license plates are offered for purchase to any eligible person whose Spouse, parent, sibling, or child is currently serving in the armed forces of the United States at the time of application. Armed forces includes members serving in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard (when mobilized to augment the Navy) to include Reservists and National Guard members.

To obtain this license plate, a registrant must:

Submit proof of current service from their Service member. Examples of this documentation include copies of one of the following:

- a. Current Leave and Earnings Statement (LES),
- b. Member's military ID card, or
- c. A letter from their unit commander on official letterhead stating the Family member's current status as a member of the U.S. armed forces; and

Provide a written statement by the Service member indicating the Family relationship with the registrant.

Proof of eligibility must be submitted for each renewal year. The initial fee for obtaining this license plate is \$25.75, and the subsequent annual fee is \$21.50. Additional charges for county and/or city wheel tax, where imposed locally, plus county clerk fees will apply. The plate cannot be personalized.

Retired members of the military may apply for this license plate if they also meet the criteria above, but may wish to obtain one of several choices of registration plates available for them in honor of their service.

Bosnia Veterans - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and are honorary discharged Veterans who served in Bosnia with the United States Armed Forces. The applicant will be required to show proof of service. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

**Bronze Star (Meritorious)** - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and who are recipients of the Bronze Star - Meritorious. The applicant must provide a letter or DD214 from the Department of Veterans Affairs indicating they are a recipient of one of the applicable medals. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

**Bronze Star (Valor)** - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and who are recipients of the Bronze Star - Valor. The applicant must provide a letter or DD214 from the Department of Veterans Affairs indicating they are a recipient of one of the applicable medals. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

Congressional Medal of Honor License Plates: Tennessee residents who are recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor, the Distinguished Service Cross, the Navy Cross, the Air Force Cross or the Legion of Valor. Initial plate is free and there is no annual fee. Applicant must provide a letter or DD214 from the Department of Veterans Affairs indicating they are a recipient of one of the applicable medals.

**Desert Storm Veteran License Plate:** This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and are honorably discharges Veterans of Desert Storm. Applicants must provide proof of service. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

Disabled Veteran License Plate: No fee for up to two (2) plates with or without the wheelchair emblem for a Veteran having served in the military services of the United States who is a resident of Tennessee and is entitled to compensation under the laws administered by the Veteran's Administration due to disability incurred in or aggravated by active military services of the U.S. The application for title and registration should be accompanied by an approval letter from the Department of Veterans Affairs stating a disability of the following: Loss or permanent loss of use of one (1) or both feet or Loss or permanent loss of use of one (1) or both hands. Permanent impairment of vision of both eyes as enumerated by statute Service connected disability, which is determined by the Veterans Administration to constitute 100% permanent total disability. Additional plates (over and above two free plates) may be obtained upon payment of the regular fee for plates and the actual cost of production (\$25.75 first year, \$21.50 for renewal). If applicant chooses to have a plate without the without the wheelchair emblem, such plate may be issued; however, only the license plate with a wheelchair emblem entitles the disabled Veteran to park in disabled parking areas. The applicant should be made aware that they would be relinquishing disabled parking privileges by choosing a plate without the wheelchair emblem.

**Distinguished Flying Cross** - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and who are recipients of the Distinguished Flying Cross. Applicants must provide a letter or DD214 from the Department of Veterans Affairs indicating they are a Distinguished Flying Cross recipient. There is no annual fee for this plate and it cannot be personalized.

**Enemy Evadee:** Available to Tennessee residents certified as an enemy evadee by the VA. Initial Fee is \$25.75. Annual Fee is \$21.50. The application must be accompanied by discharge papers from the U.S. Armed Forces that have been certified by the VA. A copy of the death certificate should be supplied in the event a surviving Spouse wishes to renew such plate.

Former Prisoner of War (Former-POW) License Plate: Residents of Tennessee who are former prisoners of WWI, WWII, the Korean War or the Vietnam War or the surviving Spouse of such former prisoner of war. First two plates are free and additional plates are \$21.50. The application should be accompanied by a certificate from the U.S. Defense Department stating the period of time the applicant was a prisoner of war. In the case of an application for continuation of a license plate or plates held by a deceased Spouse of the prisoner of war, a copy of the death certificate should be submitted. A surviving Spouse is entitled to the plates until they remarry.

**Gold Star Family Plate:** Available to a person whose Spouse, parent, sibling, or child served and died in the line of duty in the armed forces of the United States or its allies, or died as a result of injuries sustained in such service. The first plate is free. Additional plates will be \$25.75 initial issuance and \$21.50 for renewal. Applicant must provide a DD Form 1300 Report of Casualty.

Handicapped Veteran License Plate: A Veteran who has served in the United States Armed Forces who is a resident of Tennessee and who has a service-connected disability, which is determined by the federal Department of

Veterans Affairs to constitute less than one hundred percent (100%) permanent total disability. Initial Fee is \$25.75 and the Annual Fee is \$21.50. This plate does not have handicapped parking privileges with it.

Honorably Discharged - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and are honorably discharged Veterans of the United States Armed Forces. An applicant must provide proof of service. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

**Korean War** - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and are honorably discharged Veterans of the Korean War. An applicant must provide proof of service. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

Legion of Valor License Plates: Tennessee residents who are recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor, the Distinguished Service Cross, the Navy Cross, the Air Force Cross or the Legion of Valor. Initial plate is free and there is no annual fee. Applicant must provide a letter or DD214 from the Department of Veterans Affairs indicating they are a recipient of one of the applicable medals.

Operation Enduring Freedom: Available to Honorably Discharged Veterans of Operation Enduring Freedom and active members of the United States armed forces serving in Operation Enduring Freedom. Honorably Discharged - DD214 indicating receipt of campaign ribbon (Afghanistan); Active Duty - award certificate indicating receipt of campaign ribbon (Afghanistan). Annual Fee: \$21.50 - automobile; \$14.50 - motorcycle. There is an initial fee of \$25.75 for automobiles and \$16.75 for motorcycles.

Operation Iraqi Freedom: Available to Honorably Discharged Veterans of Operation Iraqi Freedom and active members of the United States armed forces serving in Operation Iraqi Freedom. Honorably Discharged - DD214 indicating receipt of campaign ribbon (Iraqi); Active Duty - award certificate indicating receipt of campaign ribbon (Iraqi). Annual Fee: \$21.50 - automobile; \$14.50 - motorcycle. There is an initial fee of \$25.75 for automobiles and \$16.75 for motorcycles.

Operation New Dawn - This plate is available to an owner or lessee of a motor vehicle who is a resident of Tennessee and who is an active member of the armed forces serving in Operation New Dawn or a honorably discharged Veteran of Operation New Dawn in the United States Armed Forces or a civilian Veteran of the United States army corps of engineers. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

**Pearl Harbor Survivor License Plates:** Any Tennessee resident who was a member of the armed forces of the United States and present at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii on December 7, 1941 and who is the owner of a motor vehicle designated for private use. Initial Fee is \$25.75 and the Annual Fee is \$21.50. A copy of the membership card from the Pearl Harbor Survivor's Association, Inc. must be provided for eligibility.

Purple Heart - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and are holders of The Purple Heart Medal. A copy of Form DD214 or the equivalent prior to 1951 (WWK 53-55), indicating the individual has been awarded the Purple Heart should accompany the application for registration. In the event neither form is available and there is other documentation which indicates the awarding of the Purple Heart, that documentation should be forwarded to the Taxpayer & Vehicle Services Division prior to issuing the plate in order that the Department of Revenue may consult with Veterans' groups to ascertain eligibility. There is no annual fee and the plate cannot be personalized. A disabled Veteran may have two plates.

Silver Star -Valor License Plate: Tennessee residents who are recipients of the Silver Star. Initial Fee is \$25.75 and the Annual Fee is \$21.50. Applicant must provide a letter or DD214 from the Department of Veterans Affairs indicating they are a recipient of one of the applicable medals.

Vietnam Veteran - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and are honorably discharged Veterans of the Vietnam War Veterans. Applicants will be required to show proof of service. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

Women Veterans - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and who is an honorably discharged member from the armed services. The applicant must submit a copy of their DD214 form. The annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

World War II - This plate is available to Tennessee residents who are registering a private passenger motor vehicle and are honorably discharged Veterans of World War II. Applicants will be required to show proof of service. The

annual fee for automobile registration is \$21.50 with an initial fee of \$25.75 required. The annual fee for motorcycle registration is \$14.50 with an initial fee of \$16.75 required. The plate cannot be personalized.

Medical claims must be submitted; Guard members remain on active duty while under doctor's care.

Eligibility: National Guard Service member on State active duty.

Worker's Compensation: Same as State employees. Increased monetary benefit of Guard member's death gratuity who are killed in action at \$100,000.

Eligibility: National Guard Service member on State active duty.

**Group Insurance:** National Guard Association of Tennessee offers Guard members \$10,000.00-\$50,000.00 for \$4.40 to \$20.40 month. Spouse: \$5,000.00 - \$10,000 - \$25,000.00 for \$2.40 - \$4.40 - \$10.40 month. Dependents: \$5,000.00 - \$10,000.00 for \$3.35 - \$6.70 (all rates monthly). Free \$10,000 coverage for new members of the National Guard (first year in TN NG).

Eligibility: National Guard Service member.

Injury/Death Benefits: Same as Worker's Compensation.

Eligibility: Disease, Injury, or Death occurs while serving on State active duty.

### Parks and Recreation:

**Lifetime Hunting/Fishing license:** A one-time \$10.00 fee for a lifetime hunting and fishing license. **Eligibility:** A Tennessee Veteran who is 30% disabled and whose disability is the result of injury or illness from wartime service or 100% disabled from service connected cause.

Hunting License: Military personnel on leave carrying leave papers are exempt for requiring a valid hunting license.

State Parks National Guard Benefits: Guard members enjoy same benefits at state parks as state employees including reduced lodging, fees, etc.

Tennessee Veterans' Discount: For camping within Tennessee State Parks from November 1 through March 31. The discount is a 15% to 25% reduction off the standard nightly base rates depending on the type of site chosen. Also provides a year-round discount to all active duty U.S. military regardless of their branch of service or where they are stationed. Disabled Veterans are eligible for year-round ADA discount that provides a 25% to 50% discount for campsites.

**Eligibility:** All Military and Veteran discounts require a proof of prior military duty. Acceptable IDs for proof of eligibility include a VA benefits card, retired military ID, or DD-214. These are in addition to proof of residency.

# Miscellaneous Benefits:

Tennessee State Veterans Home: The first home opened in Murfreesboro on June 10, 1991. Located on a seven -acre lot, deeded to the Board by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, adjacent to the Alvin C. York V.A. Medical Center, this is a 140-bed facility offering intermediate and skilled levels of nursing care in a one-story building encompassing 69,278 square feet. Legislation passed by the General Assembly in 1993 provided for construction of a second facility in Humboldt. Also a 140-bed facility offering intermediate and skilled levels of nursing care, this one-story building encompassing some 74,870 square feet opened February 7, 1996. The third home in Knoxville opened in December 2006. This 140-bed facility, offers intermediate and skilled levels of nursing care in a spacious 73,065 square foot, one-story building. In each of the three facilities, 20 of the beds are located in a secure, special needs unit. All residents are cared for in such a manner and in such an environment as to promote enhancement of

their quality of life without abridging the safety and rights of other residents. An interdisciplinary team approach to resident life is utilized to assure the quality of life. Residents and Family members are involved in the care planning process, and resident participation is encouraged through a functioning resident council. Residents' rights are posted and enforced as delineated in current federal and state standards.

Eligibility: Veterans who are entitled to medical treatment and/or other benefits from the USDVA, and who also meet at least one of the additional requirements: 1) Resident of Tennessee at time of admission; 2) Born in Tennessee; 3) Entered the U.S. Armed Forces in Tennessee; 4) Tennessee address is official Home of Record on Veteran's Military Record; 5) Has an immediate Family member (Parent, Spouse, Sibling or Child) or Legal Guardian, who would serve as primary caregiver, who is a resident of Tennessee. Spouse Widow/Widower or Gold Star Parent may also be eligible for admission on a space available basis. Upon meeting the eligibility requirements, the applicant's name will be placed on our Potential Admissions Wait List. Complete the application and provide a copy of the Veteran's discharge papers (DD214); if the applicant is not the Veteran, additional information will be requested.

**Tennessee State Cemetery for Active Duty Veterans:** There is no cost for interment or cremation for Veterans who meet eligibility requirements. There is a \$700.00 fee for the interment or cremation of a Veteran's Spouse or eligible dependent children that must be paid prior to or the day of the burial. All Veterans are entitled to a white, upright marble headstone at government expense when buried in a State Veterans Cemetery.

**Eligibility:** 1) Any person who served on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States who was discharged or released there from before September 7, 1980 under conditions other than dishonorable. 2) Any member of the Armed Forces of the United States who died while on active duty. 3) Any person who served on active duty who entered active duty as an enlisted person after September 7, 1980, and officers commissioned who entered active duty after October 17, 1981, and whose discharge or separation from active military service was under "other than dishonorable" conditions. A person whose first tour of duty began or after the dates listed above is eligible if he or she completed a continuous period of active duty of at least 24 months or the full period for which called or ordered to active duty, whichever is shorter or was released because of a hardship discharge, or has a compensable service connected disability or was released because of a service connected disability.

**Burial in Tennessee State Cemetery for Reserve and National Guard Members:** Reserve and National Guard members who are in receipt of compensation or pension from the VA are eligible for burial and do not have to pay the plot allowance, except when their claim is denied by the VA. Reserve and National Guard members who completed twenty or more years of reserve or guard service and are entitled to retirement pay are also eligible for interment.

Reserve and National Guard members are also eligible for burial under the following five (5) categories and do not have to pay the plot allowance cost, except when their claim is denied by the VA:

- 1) Dies under honorable conditions while undergoing active duty for training.
- 2) If called to active duty, completes the full period for which called up.
- 3) Dies under honorable conditions while performing full time AGR service.
- 4) Completed at least 24 months of active service.
- 5) Discharged due to service connected disability while on active duty.

**Recording of Discharges:** County Clerks will provide free recording of the official discharge of each Veteran who served in the U.S. Armed Forces, as a confidential record.

Tennessee Fallen Heroes Medal: The Tennessee Fallen Heroes Medal may be awarded on behalf of the people of the state of Tennessee to an individual serving on active duty who has been killed in action, while:

- (1) Engaged in an action against an enemy of the United States;
- (2) Engaged in military support operations involving conflict with an opposing foreign force;
- (3) Serving with friendly foreign forces engaged in an armed conflict against an opposing armed force in which the United States is not a belligerent party; or
- (4) Serving in a combat zone as designated by presidential order.

The recipient's name will be entered on the case of the Tennessee Fallen Heroes Medal. Individuals eligible to receive the Tennessee Fallen Heroes Medal include all active duty military who are legal residents of the state of Tennessee. The Tennessee Fallen Heroes Medal will be awarded solely by the governor or the governor's designee to the immediate survivor of the recipient. This law went into effect July 1, 2011 and is not retroactive.
